What is bullying?

Bullying is when someone is verbally or physically threatened or hurt by another child or group of children ***over and over again***.

Physical



Cyber

What do the teachers and children do to stop bullying at Dean Valley?

- * We follow the Dean Valley Charter making sure we treat each other with respect at all times
 - * We write our own class charters and agree to follow them
- * We have an anti-bullying prevention week every year, assemblies, PCSHE lessons and circle time address what bullying is and how to recognise it
- * We have assemblies with the PCSO and NSPCC to help us learn about how to stand up to people who show bullying behaviours
 - * We tell someone if we are being bullied so that we can get help
 - * We tell someone if we see bullying behaviours in our school

Consequences of bullying behaviours

- * Rights Reflection sheets are completed
- * social stories are done to reflect on incident
- * Parents are spoken to by class teachers
- * Parents are spoken to by the Headteacher or Assistant Headteachers
